Distinctive local offer

Stoke-on-Trent & Staffordshire has strengths in a number of related and supporting sectors, particularly applied materials which has been acknowledged by the Technology Strategy Board as a key enabling technology to the automotive industry.

Existing clusters of automotive businesses, with major investment from companies such as Jaguar Land Rover (£0.5 billion) and JCB (£150 million) in Staffordshire, have established a strong supply chain in the area and opportunities to develop this further. There are more than 39,000 people are employed in advanced manufacturing, representing 9.5% of employees, compared to the national average of 6.7%. There is a highly qualified workforce, with 19 per cent of employers undertaking workforce training while both Staffordshire and Keele Universities have widely respected engineering and computing faculties.

Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent offers lower-than-average land prices and property costs and has some of the largest development sites in the UK with many in local authority ownership. In addition, significant parts of Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent have been granted Assisted Area status for 2014-2020.

The presence of world leading automotive companies has helped establish a sound base for manufacturing, an effective supply chain, and strong R&D and educational facilities for further growth and development in the automotive industry. The Make it Stoke-on-Trent & Staffordshire inward investment service is working hard to ensure that supply chain opportunities are fully realised.
